

If you use "extra credit categories, you could earn up to five (5) credits of activities, thus leaving 8 credits. This is where the total of 60 above is derived.

Total Required Credits Transferring - 60 (including 5 extra credits of activities).

This leaves 68 required credits; subtract Student Teaching (15) and Outdoor Education (3) leaves 50 required credits (17 per semester).
